Bible Lesson

Message: *The Word of God stands forever.*

2 Timothy 3:14-17 (NIRV)

“But I want you to continue to follow what you have learned. Don't give up what you are sure of. You know the people you learned it from. You have known the Holy Scriptures ever since you were a little child. They are able to teach you how to be saved by believing in Christ Jesus.

Talk About It

Talk with your child and share your favorite Bible story you remember from the Old Testament that you learned when you were young. Why was it a story you enjoyed so much? Remind your child that by reading the Bible, we can learn more about how God expects us to live our lives. We want to please God in everything we do, and we can learn so much by just opening our Bible and reading a little bit every day. Challenge your child to read his/her Bible each day for 10 minutes. This could be a special activity that you do together each night before bed. Keep the conversations going and take time each day to discover new things together from the book we call the Bible. Talk about it.
